Y10/Y11 BOYS FOOTBALL

Last term the Year 11 football team competed in both the Solihull and Birmingham Schools Cup. Well done to all of the boys that were selected to play in the matches, all of who showed exemplary sportsmanship. The highlight of their season was a 2-1 win against North Birmingham Academy.

The year 10 team convincingly won their Solihull Cup first round tie against Heart of England School 9-0 and will now play against Arden Academy in the second round. Unfortunately, they were knocked out of the Birmingham Cup by Streetly Academy in their first round tie; we will be hoping to progress further in the competition next year.



CROSS COUNTRY

There were two Cross-Country fixtures last term, where students from years 7-9 went to Park Hall Academy to compete in a cross country league race. Our Year 7 pupils ran approximately 1650m and our Year 8's ran approximately 2325m. Two of our Year 7 pupils, Ruby H and Jonathon M came within top 20 for their event and they both competed at the county trials as a result of this on Saturday 14 October. Two of our Year 9 pupils, Brody P and Dev F, also came top 20 for their events!

There was another race for year 7-9 pupils at Langley Academy to compete in the final cross country league race. There were a lot more schools which attended this final event, but our pupils still showed great determination throughout their races. Jayden R came 7th place in the Year 8/9 race and has been invited to compete in the county championships in January! Well done to all those involved!

NETBALL

Year 7 and 9 Netball Teams also competed in a netball match against Park Hall Academy. It was the first time both teams had competed against another school and they played incredibly well. At half time, our Year 7 team were winning 4-3 and our Year 9's were unfortunately losing 3-1. However, after a quick team talk and a few adjustments, both teams began the second half determined to come out with the best possible outcome. By the end of the match, the Year 7 team won with a score of 12:7 and the Year 9 team won with a score of 8:5!

YEAR 7 BOYS FOOTBALL

The Year 7 boys football team were involved in a Satellite Competition at John Henry Newman school.

YEAR 8/9 FOOTBALL

The Year 8 Football team managed to win 2-1 against Lode Heath! An early goal from Grace put us in the lead until the end of the first half where Lode Heath scored an equalizer. This was a very tight game but a last minute goal from Grace managed to secure a win!

The Y8 football team also attended a satellite tournament consisting of 4 games each. Both teams managed to secure a win for their first game, blowing the opposing teams out of the water with a minimum of a 2 goal lead.
